Hampton Park Historic District

EFFECTIVE APRIL 15, 2024

The Hampton Park Historic District was established by the Sumter City Council in 1979 and remains the city's sole primarily residential historic district. Covering 120 acres and 268 parcels, it is bounded by Church Street to the east, Hampton Avenue to the south, and McQueen Street to the west. The district extends northward beyond Calhoun Street and includes blocks of Church Street up to Broad Street. With the growth of the downtown core adjacent to the Hampton Park District, traffic pressures have risen, prompting residents' concerns about speeding and noise from emergency vehicles. This study aimed to address these issues for Calhoun Street through focus groups, surveys, and public meetings. Stantec Consulting Services Inc., the consultant for this project, conducted thorough field surveys, including lighting assessments, crash rates (provided by Sumter/SCDOT), traffic volumes (Sumter/SCDOT), turning movement counts at six intersections, floating car studies, and speed studies. Focus groups involved residents, Prisma / Tuomey Medical Center staff, emergency responders, law enforcement, fire department personnel, and local planning staff. Two public meetings were held, one on September 1st to refine issues and another on December 8, 2015, to review proposed recommendations and gather feedback.

The Traffic Engineer for the PE District (dated September 06, 2023) indicated that SCDOT has confirmed that two traffic signals on W. Calhoun do not meet the requirements for signalization and can be replaced with 4-way stops. The Heart of Sumter

and area residents encouraged the Sumter Mayor and Council to consider and vote for approval. As a trial solution, "Starting April 15, 2024, drivers on W. Calhoun will need to observe four-way stops at the following intersections":

- a. W. Calhoun @ N. Purdy Street the signal at West Calhoun St. and N. Purdy Street will be removed and replaced with a 4-way stop.
- b. W. Calhoun @ Church Street the signal at West Calhoun and Church St. will be removed and replaced with a 4-way stop.
- a. N. Salem Street and W. Calhoun Street a 4-way stop will be installed.
